The course in Interpretation of Dramatic Literature is intended to develop a recognition of the elements of dramatic form and an awareness of the means employed by the playwright in developing his theme. Theatrical symbolism, illusion, style and type provide guides to the technical and aesthetic structure of a dramatic work of art. Short papers and an essay analyzing the play which the participant will select for a project are required.
